

DENTAL IMPLANTS: How Are They Done?

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Dental Implant treatment is divided into two distinct phases. The first phase is called the **Surgical Phase**. The second phase is called the **Prosthetic Phase**.

Implant Placement Phase

Fee: \$1280

With IV Sedation (\$425)

Fee: \$1705

With Oral Sedation (\$98)

X-rays show adequate bone height and width for a dental implant.



The gum tissue is raised to expose the underlying bone.



A drill is used to create a precise hole into which the implant is placed.



The implant is inserted and screwed into place.

One-Stage Surgery



A healing cap is placed on top of the implant.

Two-Stage Surgery



The gum tissue is closed over the implant.



In a second surgery six months later, a healing cap is placed on top of the implant.



The gum tissue is placed around the healing cap.

Prosthetic Phase

Fee: \$1350



The implant is now fused to the bone. The healing cap is removed. An impression is taken and sent to the laboratory.



An "abutment" is now screwed onto the top of the implant. It holds the crown.



The final crown is made and cemented over the abutment.
